

This is the sixth in a series of monthly historic notes leading up to our 2025 centennial:

In 1835, the Rev. James Lynch Belin formally established the Waccamaw Neck Mission. The Mission was supported by circuit rider ministers, and the Rev. Belin saw the need for a meeting place and a permanent residence. In 1853, his Mission House was constructed at Cedar Hill, in a location not far from our current sanctuary. The Rev. Belin lived at this house with his wife, Charlotte, until his untimely death May 19, 1859. In his will, any property not left to Charlotte was given to the Trustees of the South Carolina Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South.

Some of the land included with that property is today's Belin Memorial UMC campus, and the Mission House is today a private Murrells Inlet residence.
